15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, the City of South Fulton ("City") is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Georgia;
19 20 21	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the City is charged with preserving the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens;
22 23 24	WHEREAS, the City Council finds that enforcement of the State law prohibiting possession of less than one ounce of marijuana has been inequitable and has fallen disproportionately on certain subsets of the population;
25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, arrest and/or conviction for the State law offense of possession of less than one ounce of marijuana presents employment obstacles which marginalize broad swaths of the population;
29 30 31 32	WHEREAS, the City Council desires to facilitate equity in the administration of criminal justice; and
33 34 35 36	WHEREAS, O.C.G.A. § 36-32-6 grants municipal courts concurrent jurisdiction to try to dispose of cases wherein a person is charged with possession of one ounce or less of marijuana when such conduct occurs inside a municipality.
37 38	THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH FULTON HEREBY ORDAINS as follows:
39 40	<b>Section 1:</b> The City of South Fulton Code of Ordinances, Chapter 1, Title 15, Offenses, is hereby established and enacted as follows:

Sec. 15-1006. Civil possession offense.

- (a) Civil Offense. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess one ounce or less of marijuana within the corporate limits of the city.
- (b) *Jurisdiction*. The municipal court is granted jurisdiction to try and dispose of cases where a person is charged with the possession of one ounce or less of marijuana if the offense occurred within the corporate limits of the city. The jurisdiction of the municipal court shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of any other courts within the county having jurisdiction to try and dispose of such cases.
- (c) *Penalty*. A civil fine, not exceeding \$150.00, shall be assessed against any person found to be in violation of this code section. The finding of a violation under this section shall be a civil infraction, and shall not constitute a criminal infraction or offense for any purpose.
- (d) *Transfer as a right*. Any person charged with possession of an ounce or less of marijuana under this section shall be entitled, on request, to have their case transferred to the court within the county having general misdemeanor jurisdiction over the alleged offense.
- (e) Rehabilitation and Prevention. Fifty percent of the fines collected under this section shall be used by the City towards City Council approved alcohol/drug rehabilitation and prevention programs which benefit City residents.
- Section 2. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that: (a) All sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed by the City Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.
- (b) To the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. No section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.
- (c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the City Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not
